Hi Everyone,

I would like to give you an update on the parsonage. As you recall, last year the congregation voted to authorize the Board of Business and Finance to move forward with the marketing and sale of our parsonage at As we know all too well, there were decades of "deferred maintenance" on the house and only emergency repairs were conducted as issues arose. The decision was made to make improvements to existing components before we engaged a realtor. To date, the cost for the materials was approximately \$26,000 with an additional \$16,000 for the roof replacement, bringing the total cost to well above \$40,000. This is where the blessings of our congregation come into play. I want to highlight the "major players" in this effort, with the caveat statement that MANY hands were part of this endeavor overall. Over this time there were tons of emails, texts and phone calls between a lot of folks asking opinions on colors, next steps, and guidance in many areas including paint and cabinet colors. I am not sure who had the chance to see the parsonage over the years, but it needed significant repair and upgrading including all the floors, walls painted, BRAND NEW bathrooms, kitchen & appliances among countless other smaller fixes and upgrades, too numerous to mention. The work is finished, and the roof is being replaced this week.

I don't even know where to begin on how thankful we all are for their expertise and the enormous amount of work that I assure you included blood, sweat and tears. The masterful level of work turned an average, worn out house into a very beautiful property. At the end of the day, our hope and prayer is that by the sale of the parsonage we will realize a reduction to our risk management profile, insurance cost, utilities and maintenance costs. The proceeds from the sale will greatly help stabilize our current financial situation and allow us to complete high priority projects. The realtor posted the parsonage last week, and within a couple hours she had showings scheduled. This past weekend we signed off and accepted an offer. Note: We had several valid offers to review over the past week! That is why the website link

shows it as "off the market". We will keep everyone updated on the status leading up to the anticipated closing at the end of April. More important than the mechanics of the business side of this process, is the fact that we would not have this opportunity, not even remotely, if we didn't have the people with the know-how, talent, ability and willingness to step up and provide this Labor of Love.

## **TECH TIP CORNER**

### Tech Tip #2:

Additional tips to avoid being scammed:

- Amazon, the IRS, your bank and other legitimate businesses, will never ask you to share your password, account sign-in One-Time Password (OTP), or verify sensitive personal information over the phone. Hang up and call the business back on a phone number that you know is correct. Don't rely on the number that called you!!!
- If you accidentally disclose your password, try logging into the website asap and change your password right away.
