LETTER FROM PASTOR ELVA

Dear Friends,

The New Testament book of Acts is full of encounters between the apostles and all kinds of people, as the apostles spread the good news of God's love in Jesus Christ. One of my favorite encounters is between the apostle Philip and a court official from Ethiopia.

The Ethiopian is traveling back to his country after a visit to Jerusalem. Philip has been led by the Holy Spirit to the wilderness road the Ethiopian is traveling. As the Ethiopian rides along this road in his chariot, Philip hears him reading aloud from Isaiah's prophecy about Jesus.

He calls up to the Ethiopian, asking if he understands what he is reading. The other man replies, "How can I, unless someone guides me?"

Philip proceeds to tell him the good news of God's love in Jesus. The Ethiopian is so excited to hear this good news that, when they come to some water, he wants to be baptized! He climbs down from his chariot, and Philip baptizes him. He then "goes on his way rejoicing," while Philip is called by the Spirit to another place (Acts 9: 26 - 39).

This encounter between Philip and the Ethiopian is brief. There are no long speeches or extended conversations. But both men are brought together and powerfully moved by God's Spirit. Both are touched by God's love in Jesus Christ.

As I conclude my service as your Bridge Minister, I know our time together has also been brief. But in the few months I have served among you, I have felt God's Spirit at work in your congregation. Serving in your midst, I have been touched by God's love in Jesus, and I hope you have as well.

Thank you for all the kindness you have shown me during my time with you. Thank you for your willingness to share your faith journey. Thank you for everything you've done to support our ministry together.

Now we go our separate ways. You move into a new season of ministry with the wise and capable leadership of the Rev. Thomas Hawkins. My prayer is that you will continue to sense God's Spirit moving among you, and that you will be open to God's guidance. May you all be enlivened by God's love in Jesus Christ.

NEIGHBORS IN NEED "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." - Galatians 6:2


Advocacy is essential to participating in God's mission in the world. Gifts to the Neighbors in Need offering support ministries of justice and compassion in the United Church of Christ.
